RE: CORRIGENDUM TO DIV. MEMO NO. 188, s.2016
(Division Search for 2016 Brigada Eskwela Best Implementing Schools Winners)

1. This is to effect changes in the previously issued Div. Memo No. 188, s. 2016 where it was erroneously typed that San Jose Elementary School of Talavera, Nueva Ecija placed 3rd in the Small School Category - Elementary. The said school garnered the same weighted average with Tomas Joson Elementary School of Quezon, Nueva Ecija.
2. Likewise, Malacañang High School of Sta. Rosa, Nueva Ecija was omitted from the list of CD-III winners in the Small School Category - Secondary. It is to be corrected that instead of Paitan Sur NHS (which belongs to CD - I) it should be written as Malacañang High School of Sta. Rosa, Nueva Ecija.
